It is said that it is difficult for those who are not involved to understand the overall structure and actual application of R-Foundation information, so we will hold the seminar focusing on case studies using grants.




Figure: 2022-23 All Districts RAC Survey Results (Population: 21 Districts)

(Background)

D2750 Governor Tomizawa introduced Robbie, the immediate past president of Rotaract Club of the Marianas of District PBG (PALAU, SAIPAN, GUAM, CHUUK, POHNPEI) to RIJYEM.

(Summary of Activities) Note: GBHWC (Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center) GBHWC issued a Request for Proposals in May 2015 to identify eligible nonprofit organizations to subgrant SAMHSA federal grant funds in the Guam PEACE Partnership for Success program.

In response to that Request for Proposal, the Rotaract Club of the Marianas submitted a proposal and was evaluated as one of the nonprofit organizations eligible to receive federal grant funds through GBHWC's Guam PEACE Partnerships for Success program, and the GUAM Government signed a contract with the Rotaract Club of the Marianas in May 2015.

The activities of the contract include the following (in brief)

In accordance with the Strategic Prevention Framework, Rotaract Club of the Marianas agrees to

- 1. implement the submitted Regional Action Plan; under the guidance of the PACE PFS Evaluator and staff, develop an evaluation plan to assess all activities identified in the Regional Action Plan and establish appropriate process and outcome measures Collect and report process and outcome data identified in the evaluation plan to the PEACE PFS evaluator.
- 2. participate in trainings and technical assistance activities related to the Partnership for Success to build capacity on prevention, implement prevention-related activities, and prepare to sustain positive outcomes
- 3. prepare and submit bi-monthly and year-end reports to the GBWHC describing accomplishments, challenges, and lessons learned from the Partnership for Success and Community Action Plan
- 4. a description of how the funds will be used (content omitted)

(Federal grant amount)

GBHWC will be compensated in an amount not to exceed \$100,000 for the initial period for work performed in accordance with the scope of work in Section II and the agreed upon Regional Action Plan/Budget detailed in Appendix A.
